

As you know, Peace ended 2025 with a budget surplus of more than \$50,000. At its February Meeting, the council divvied the surplus up in the following way: \$26,976 to General Fund Reserve; \$5,220 to Christikon Scholarships; \$7,000 to Lutheran Family Services Rocky Mountain; \$1,500 to Nations to Neighbors; \$1,500 to Lutheran Disaster Response for California fires; \$10,000 to council discretion for distribution throughout the year.

The council also heard many of the suggestions given at the Annual Meeting and is working on ways to fund some of the projects at Peace and in the community. Stay tuned for updates throughout the year!





Family Promise March, 2025

Peace will be hosting Family Promise March 16-23. The volunteer sign-up board will be in the narthex.

Here are some of the ways you can help.

Set Up ~ Sunday, March 16 right after church come one downstairs! We will make the beds and get the rooms ready for our guests.

Evening meals ~ Peace will provide meals for the families on Tuesday, March 18, Wednesday, March 19 and Saturday, March 22. We will let you know before those days how many adults and children we will feed and if there are allergies. Families are usually at the church by 6, so that is when we plan to eat. Most of these families have known food insecurities their whole lives, finding something everyone likes can be tricky (actually, that's kind of like family dinners at my house!). Here are a few ideas ~ breakfast for dinner, tacos, spaghetti, ham, mac and cheese, pizza. Whatever you choose for the menu will be very appreciated (and we'll have hot dogs in the freezer in case there's those picky eaters!).

Please be at the church by 5:30p.m. and plan to leave by 8 p.m. You will be the people who will see the families more than any other volunteer. We'll have coloring, games and toys out for the kids so you can interact with them and their parents. Most go to bed very early because they get up very early!

Overnight Hosts ~ you get to spend the night at the church!! Jody, our cot maintenance person, will be working on the cots so we can get them more comfortable. I have 2 camping mattresses that fit perfectly on the cots. You can put your sleeping bag on top of the pad. It's pretty comfy!

Your job is to help if the families need anything in the night. It rarely happens, but we are there in case. We like to have 2 hosts. We have had hosts that bring their kids for the overnight. We ask that overnight hosts be at the church by 8 p.m. Most everyone is in bed by then! They leave at 6 a.m., so you can leave when everyone has left the church.

Take down ~ this will happen Sunday, March 23 after church.

Laundry ~ Peace is responsible for washing 3-4 bundles of laundry after our guests leave. We wash pillow cases, protectors, sheets, mattress pads, blankets, and quilts. We ask that people take a laundry bundle, wash what's in the bundle and bring it back to church. Please put it in the Family Promise storage room ~ the room off the Fellowship Hall in the basement. We'll put the clean laundry away.

We hope you will consider volunteering during our Family Promise week. We get to be part of the beginning of change for homeless families. It all makes a difference in someone's life.

IRISH STEW

INGREDIENTS:

2 LB Beef Chuck (cut into 1 in. cubes)

1/4 cup All-Purpose flour

1 tsp Salt

1/2 tsp Pepper

2 tbsp Olive oil

1 Onion (finely chopped)

1/2 cup Beef broth

1 Bay leaf

2 cups Baby carrots

4 Russet Potatoes (peeled and cut into 1 in. cubes)

DIRECTIONS:

Place the beef cubes, flour, and salt and pepper in a large ziptop bag or bowl.

In a large skillet, heat oil until shimmering, add the beef cubes and brown on all sides. Do not crowd meat in the pan. Do this in batches if you pan is not large enough. Remove meat to the crockpot.


Add the onions to the drippings in the skillet and sauté until tender. Add onions to the crockpot.

Stir in the beef broth and bay leaf. Cover and cook on LOW for 4 hours.

Add the carrots and potatoes and stir gently to combine. Cook on LOW for another two to four hours or until mean and veggies are tender.

Add salt and pepper to taste.

Worship News

March 1 & 2- Transfiguration

Witnesses to the glory of God in the face of Jesus reflect that glory in the world. It was true for Moses. It was doubtless true for Peter, James, and John. We pray that it will be true of all of us who see God's glory in the word and in the supper and who are being "transformed into the same image" by God's Spirit.

Exodus 34:29-35; Psalm 99; 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2; Luke 9:28-43a

March 5 (Ash Wednesday) Everything [in] Between Intention & Action

The "would-be followers" (as the NRSVUE calls them) have good intentions. They want to follow Jesus, but Jesus calls them to put their money where their mouths are. Somewhere between good intentions and impulsive action lies discipleship. On Ash Wednesday, we make a commitment to align our intentions and our actions.

Luke 9:51-62

March 8 & 9 Everything [in] Between Stranger & Neighbor

This parable begins and ends with the question, "Who is my neighbor?" and the answer is surprisingly, "the stranger." The Samaritan, whose place of worship and customs are different from the lawyer who questions Jesus, is both a stranger and a neighbor to the man who was beaten and left in a ditch.

In our world, many of our physical neighbors are strangers to us, and many of our neighbors—those closest to us—feel like strangers in divisive political climates. If we align our intentions and actions, then maybe we need to reconsider who we label as "stranger," and ask ourselves if we have acted as good neighbors.

Luke 10:25-37

March 15 & 16 Everything [in] Between Faith & Works

In many translations, Jesus says that "Mary has chosen the better part," which has been used to create a divide between Mary and Martha. However, in the Greek, Mary has chosen the "good portion," and Martha's tasks are called "ministry." Therefore, perhaps Mary represents our faith, our desire to know God intimately, and Martha represents our good works, our desire to transform the world. Both are needed, and both are good.

Luke 10:38-42

March 22 & 23 Everything [in] Between Rest & Growth

The gardener in the vineyard knows the fig tree needs rest, nutrients, and time—and it also needs to produce fruit. Both things are true, which is also true for us. If we are always striving for more growth without taking time to rest, we will burn out. But if we are only ever resting, we won't bear fruit or grow. The fig tree also teaches us that the in between time—of nurture before fruit—can be where transformation begins.

Luke 13:6-9

March 29 & 30 Everything [in] Between Lost & Found

Herding sheep is a never-ending task. As soon as one is found, another may go missing. Our lives have a similar ebb and flow—in one moment we might feel like we have it all together, and in the next, we're struggling to survive. The promise of this parable is that no matter how "lost" we feel, the Good Shepherd is by our side.

1 Give thanks for God's compassion, forgiveness and concern for humanity, which extend far beyond rules, borders, ideologies and bias. Pray that we are inspired to do likewise!

2 Thank God for the example of Jesus Christ, focusing not on his crucifixion but on what God reveals to us through his journey of life, suffering, death and resurrection.

3 Pray for lasting and resilient peace in the Holy Land and Middle East, that those who have suffered and lost much will experience justice, hope and healing as they rebuild their lives and communities. 4 Praise God for young people who serve our neighbors through ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM), working alongside global companion churches and organizations. Pray that their yearlong journeys will be blessings to the communities they serve and will strengthen their faith, clarity of vocation and understanding of people in diverse contexts.

5 Ash Wednesday Pray that we will wear the mark of the cross on our foreheads with humility and repentance and will remember why we are baptized into Christ: to proclaim the gospel, bear love and mercy into the world, serve our neighbors, strive for justice, grow in faith and glorify God in all we do and say.

6 Ask the Spirit to guide us through the season of Lent, that it might strengthen our faith in God's sacrificial love through Jesus Christ. Give thanks for the knowledge that we live in God's allencompassing grace, given despite our weakness, uncertainty and arrogance.

7 Lift up praise and thanksgiving that God is perfect, impartial and ever present, defending those who suffer

8 Remember in prayer our national leaders, that they will exercise wisdom, compassion, justice, mercy, respect for the diversity of humankind and attentiveness to those who are neglected and excluded. Pray that our leaders will foster well-being in our communities, nation and world.

9 Pray that the Spirit will give us strength whenever we are tempted to stray from the ways of God, revealed to us in human terms through the life of Jesus Christ.

10 Give thanks for moments of joy and celebration in your life and the lives of your neighbors and siblings in Christ.

11 Who is our neighbor? Pray that we might recognize people everywhere in the world as our neighbors, created by and beloved of God and sharing with us a common lineage.

12 Ask God to bless our congregations' community meals during Lent, that we might build relationships, reflect in prayer and feel renewed in our enthusiasm for doing God's work in the world.

13 "When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue them and honor them" (Psalm 91:15). Lift up prayers of gratitude to God, who hears our pleading and lamentations and does not ignore or abandon us.

14 Give thanks for the ELCA Fund for Leaders scholarship program, which supports students attending ELCA seminaries so that they can graduate with less debt and respond to God's call as the church needs and the Spirit leads.

15 Pray for the ELCA AMMPARO Migrant Ministry, ELCA Witness in Society, ELCA World Hunger, Global Refuge, Lutheran Services in America and other partner ministries and organizations that uphold basic human rights, address causes of migration and help immigrants, asylum-seekers and refugees rebuild their lives in our country.



PRAYER VENTURES March

16 "O God, you know all that we think or do, you know the pain we put each other through. Lord, have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord, grant us peace" (WOV 739). Praise God for the boundless love and forgiveness that create a new spirit within us and enable us to change how we behave toward our neighbors.

17 Remember in prayer the 240 ELCA missionaries who serve alongside global church partners in more than 40 countries, doing God's work in the world and supporting the growth of new congregations, urban and youth outreach, theological education, pursuit of justice and peace, and leadership training.

18 Remember in prayer congregations that are working through leadership transitions, assessing their missions and resources, and searching for pastors, deacons or others to become teachers and leaders.
19 "The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me" (Martin Luther, Table Talk). Pray that the word of God in Scripture will lay hold of us and reveal something new to us each time we read the Bible, hear it read aloud or reflect on its implications for our daily lives.

20 First Day of Spring Sing praises and lift up prayers of joy and thanksgiving for the new life, light and hope that emerge with spring — awesome gifts from God, the Creator.

21 Thank God for the ELCA's special relationship with The Episcopal Church, a full communion partner since 1999. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor..

22 Water is a gift from God and a vital resource that sustains all living things. Pray for wisdom and discipline that we might preserve, manage and restore water resources essential to food production and life itself for people around the world.

23 Let us repent our sins to God, just as we are, asking God's forgiveness, guidance and transformation.

24 Pray that our Lenten reflections and conversations will lead us to a clearer sense of our identity, our mission and our calling to proclaim the lifechanging gospel of Jesus Christ.

25 Give thanks for godparents and baptismal sponsors who encourage our faith, teaching us to live as children of God and followers of Christ throughout our baptismal journeys.

26 "O God, you are my God; I seek you; my soul thirsts for you" (Psalm 63:1). Reflect on the longings of your soul and give thanks that the Spirit moves with us through Lent, leading us to the foot of the cross.

27 Give thanks for ELCA Ministries of Diverse Cultures and Communities, which works with ELCA congregations, synods, agencies and institutions to make the church more culturally diverse, anti-racist and inclusive of all God's children.

28 God's pardon of our human shortcomings and sin can never be earned or bought. Pray that, forgiven and freed in Jesus Christ, we will respond with gratitude, compassion and mercy for others. 29 Give thanks for the Evangelical Lutheran Education Association (ELEA), which supports, equips and encourages Lutheran educators, and for our congregations' faith-based day care centers and preschools, which provide safe and nurturing environments for faith formation.

30 Hallelujah! God's loving embrace surpasses our wildest hopes, restoring us as God's children through the life, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

31 Ask the Spirit to equip, inspire and guide us as ambassadors of Christ in the world, children of God who love our neighbors in need and share the good news with everyone.
